Siddharth Prakash

Since 2011, Dr. Prakash has worked in the John Ritter Research Program in Aortic and Vascular Diseases at McGovern Medical School in the University of Texas at Houston. At UT-Houston, his basic research focuses on the contribution of rare genomic copy number variants (CNVs) to bicuspid aortic valve (BAV), the most common adult congenital heart defect. Dr. Prakash uses an innovative strategy to identify new candidate genes for BAV, based in part on the hypothesis that reduced dosage of genes on the X chromosome is responsible for the increased prevalence of BAV in males and in women with Turner syndrome. He identified recurrent CNVs in diverse clinical cohorts with BAV, and demonstrated that specific rare CNVs are an important contributing cause of thoracic aortic aneurysms



Kate Richardson



Kate graduated from The University of Texas at Austin in 2014 with a BS in Human Biology, concentration in Genetics and Biotechnology and received her MS in Genetic Counseling from Genetic Counseling, the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston in May 2018. As faculty, Kate assists in the LoneStar Leadership Education in Autism and Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (LEND) Program, the UT Tuberous Sclerosis Center of Excellence, teaches genetic counseling students, and runs a weekly camp for children with a metabolic disorder. Michael Silberbach

Michael Silberbach, MD – Dr. Silberbach is a Professor of Pediatric Cardiology and Radiology at Oregon Health and Science University. He has a busy clinical practice. His research interests focus on children with genetically triggered heart disease and cardiovascular disease in Turner syndrome (TS) in particular. Since 2003, he has directed the TSSUS Turner Syndrome Healthy Heart Project. This longitudinal study aims to understand the normal growth of the aorta in TS and to document the natural history of aortic disease in Turner syndrome. Dr. Silberbach is a member and past chair of the TSSUS Professional Advisory Board and the TSSUS Scientific Advisory Board. His ultimate goal is to identify pathways related to the deficient second sex chromosome that results in cardiovascular disease. Hopefully, this will bring to light why people with TS have an inordinate risk for congenital heart disease (bicuspid aortic valve in particular), systemic hypertension, and coronary vascular disease, and may provide important insights into the cardiovascular protective effects of the x chromosome in the general population.



Blair Stevens

Blair Stevens is a prenatal genetic counselor with 15 years experience in direct patient care and serves as the Director of Prenatal Genetic Counseling services at McGovern Medical School at UTHealth Houston, Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology & Reproductive Sciences. She sees patients at the Fetal Center at Children's Memorial Hermann and has served in various leadership positions within the National Society of Genetic Counselors.





Emediong Udo, MD

Emediong Udo, MD is a pediatric endocrinology fellow physician at UT Health in Houston.
